TRAP & SKEET REPORT

We all enjoyed the friendly competition and the lunch, so both teams were really winners. Watch for the next competition and come join the fun. Trap & Skeet Report:

Shooting continues on the trap and skeet fields, Sundays at 11:30 and Tuesdays with skeet about 5 and trap starting at 6:30.

You can shoot any straight wall pistol cartridges at the falling plate matches on the second Saturday of the month. 9:00 AM at the pistol range. We have classifications for most any handgun and for .22 rifles. Come mow 'em down. A special challenge to the Jensens to come back and give me a chance for revenge!!!

The pistol range will be in use by West Shore Law Enforcement classes during August Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 5-9.

Metallic Silhouette Shoot:

The action continues with the youth section on the first Saturday of August and September. CPL Training Class:

The next CPL Training Class is set for Friday evening, September 23rd and all day Saturday, September 24th.

This class provides the qualification documentation that entitles you to apply for a Concealed Pistols License under the revised Michigan Statute. Friday evening is the Legal section and Saturday is a combination of class room and range firing, followed by the written test. The class is presented by range firing, followed by the written test. The class is presented by qualified law enforcement and legal authorities and our NRA certified instructors, as mandated by law. Students **MUST** attend both the Friday and Saturday sessions to be awarded a certificate.

The cost is \$50 for Fin & Feather Members and \$125.00 for non members, which covers the instructional materials and use of the Fin & Feather facility. Students provide their own handgun, ammunition (100 rounds minimum), eye and ear protection and a sack lunch for Saturday. We can provide loaner handguns by advance arrangement.

The class is limited to 18 students, so we encourage making a reservation early. Please contact Walt Olmstead (231) 843-7636 to make your reservation.

Basic Pistol Class:

COWBOY ACTION SHOOTING IS COMING TO MASON COUNTY:

Mark your calendars for Saturday, August 20th. The Fin & Feather Club will host its first "Cowboy Action Shoot" (CAS) on that day. CAS is said to be the fastest growing shooting sport in America, but what is CAS? CAS is a multifaceted shooting sport in which contestants compete with firearms typical of those used to tame the Old West. Typically, four pre-1899 guns are fired in several stages, course of fire, and scored for speed and accuracy.

The shooting competition is stages in an Old West style starting with each contestant assuming an alias, which can be registered with SASS, Single Action Shooting Society, the parent organization of CAS. Names like Badlands Bud, Cayuse Jack and Thorny Rose will be heard being called to the firing line. The Old West continues with each shooter dressing in period correct or western movie attire.

Steel targets are large and place up close. Pistol targets of 16 inches are placed between 15 and 20 feet, rifle targets of 18 inches are placed at 35 to 40 feet and shotgun targets are placed in between. There is a unique shooting order set for each stage shoot.

The four firearms used are; lever or pump rifle with exposed hammer in pistol caliber 25-20 or larger. Typical rifles include original 1860 Henry to 1894 Winchester and the Colt Lighting pump. The 1873 and 1892 Winchester in 357/38 or 45 LC caliber are the most common. Shotguns are 1860 to 1899 side-by-side, pump, or lever action between 20 and 10 gauge. Side-by-sides can be either internal or external hammered but without auto ejectors. Lever and pump shotguns must be tube fed and have an external hammer. The most common shotgun is the model 97 Winchester followed closely by the 20 inch barreled coach gun with internal hammers. Revolvers must be single action .32 caliber or larger and may have fixed or adjustable sights. The Ruger Vaquero because of its rugged design and the 1873 Colt SAA because of its classic design are the most common revolvers used. 357/38 followed closely by 45 LC is the most common calibers.

Rifle and revolver ammunition must be all lead of a single-projectile design, no jacketed, semi-jacketed, plated, gas checked, or copper washed ammunition is allowed. Rifle ammunition must have a muzzle velocity less than 1,400 fps. And revolver ammunition must have a muzzle velocity less than 1,000 fps. 7-900 fps for both is most common. Shotgun ammunition must be number 4 lead birdshot or smaller, 7 to 9 is the most common and no steel, plated shot, or magnum-high velocity loads are allowed.

There are several different categories of shooting based on the style of guns, shooting technique, age and gender. Scoring is based on elapsed shooting time with added penalty time for misses or shooting targets out of the prescribed order.

Safety and fun are the biggest aspects of Cowboy Action Shooting. Vintage firearms, authentic costuming, unique targets and fast action make Cowboy Action Shooting one of the most interesting of all shooting sports for both spectator and contestant. Come join us on August 20th and relive the fantasy of your youth helping out TV and Movie heroes rid the West of bad guys. Registration is between 8:30 and 9:30, mandatory shooters meeting at 9:30 with shooting to follow.
